



PUBLIC ORDER AND PUBLIC SAFETY TRAINING

We achieve this by showing delegates how to maximise their command and control of protest situations using proven models and tactics.

Key areas of learning concentrate on alternatives to use of force and establishing or improving control measures should force be necessary. Our programs allow agencies and departments to establish transferable command, planning and deployment, communication and tactical option skills which assist them establish mutual aid options should such be required.

Our team are amongst the most academically but more importantly operationally experienced public order experts available today. Their skills were honed during the conflict in Northern Ireland where they faced some of the most violent pre-planned and spontaneous public order situations in the world. The methods and tactics they developed based on these experiences have seen a massive reduction in violence and damage to property and are now embedded in UK public order training.
